Honorable Judge, Ladies and Gentlemen, I thank you ALL for your valuable time, I thank you for being here for it is We The People who decide what laws we want to live by, what laws we trust our police to enforce on us out there every day in our American society. It is We The People who determine what freedoms we are willing to give up in exchange for collective security. The freedoms we enjoy in this great society are unparallel in the history of all human civilizations. These freedoms have been handed down to us from the founding of this great nation by our constitutional fathers trough The Bill of Rights of the people which has been modified throughout history to give more rights and liberties to the people of this great nation. One of the earliest rights retained by the people is:

“The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated; and no Warrants shall issue but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.” The Fourth Amendment.

Here before us is a complaint against Texas Department of Public Safety where professional Lawmen have violated the heart of **The Fourth Amendment** right which the People have reserved for themselves since the founding of our American Laws. The defendant, Texas Department of Public Safety has without cause pulled me over on the Interstate freeway 35E and told me to follow the police car back to the police station where my Motor Home was thoroughly searched without legal foundation. My right to be secure in my person, house, papers and effects was intentionally violated on Sunday, March 04 2001 during my seven hour detention. I believe that if one persons right is trespassed by the police then all People’s rights are violated to a small degree. ALL 330 million Americans have lost a little freedom on March 04 2001 when the Defendant searched my Motor Home without a Search Warrant. A search of a persons house, papers, things or effects should not be conducted simply because the police can force such a search, a search should only be conducted when it is a must, when it is necessary for the safety and welfare of the people in our society. This is why the necessary authorization to search a persons house, papers things or effects is a multi step process involving judges, the most senior members of the Criminal Justice system in America. I believe in standing up for my rights and I stand up for the rights of ALL 330 million Americans in our country here today. I believe this court will restore that little freedom which was lost when the Defendant trespassed on my right to be free from a warrant less police search of my home on Sunday, March 04 2001.
